## **Our Mission**

We are museum and heritage development specialists working with the museum and heritage sector in the South West of England to effect positive and lasting change.

Together we create opportunities which build confidence and skills, encourage innovation, and celebrate our heritage and culture.

## Our 2018-22 Programme

- We provide development services for museums across the South West.

- Our work has been developed through extensive consultation with museums regarding their priorities.
- We deliver specialist services in audiences, collections, digital and volunteering alongside local support services and regional programmes.
- Our programme ensures that museums, no matter what their size or scope, can access professional expertise and opportunities to build their resilience.
- We are responsive; our programme adapts to support museums to navigate through challenges at local, national and global level.
- Our work is supported by Arts Council England as the national development agency for museums in England. We maximise our Arts Council grant through working in partnership to align existing and new funding opportunities for museums.

## What did the museum sector in the South West look like in 2019/20?

- 66% of museums in the South West are independent; 49% of these museums receive fewer than 10,000 visitors per year.
- There were 2,219,166 Adult visits and 306,132 Child visits to museums in the South West in 2019/20 generating £47.2 million in the regional economy. In addition to this, there were 371,974 visitors to National museums in the region.\*\*
- 7,955 volunteers supported museums in the region, which equates to 20% of all volunteers in England, contributing 651,200 hours and an economic value of volunteer hours of £8 million.

## Introduction

Museums have long been a stabilising force in our communities; they are familiar and frequented places. Yet they are also dynamic institutions, actively seeking and responding to the world around them. They are places for learning and fun, where we can create connection and thrive. Museums have faced many challenges in recent years, but South West Museum Development is uniquely placed to work with staff and volunteers alike to help them navigate through these new and unexpected challenges.

One of the ways South West Museum Development achieves this is by adding value and increasing the development opportunities available to museums in the South West. The securing of inward investment alongside the core Arts Council England grant enables the team to deliver an enhanced and diverse programme of support for museums.

Funding agreements with 18 Local Authorities supports the investment South West Museum Development makes in the local Museum Development Officer infrastructure providing valuable and locally specific development support for museums. Project funding secured from National Lottery Heritage Fund and The Baring Foundation through The British Museum has enabled the team to work closely with museums to make lasting and meaningful change from governance through to public engagement.

Our region's museums also receive access to specialist advice from regional officers in audiences, collections, digital and volunteering, helping museums to widen access, encourage participation and champion our heritage. This year also saw the team jointly develop and deliver additional opportunities for support, skills development and grants with regional and national partners including Arts Fundraising and Philanthropy, Collections Trust and the Group for Education in Museums.

2019/20 saw the release of Arts Council's new ten year strategy Let's Create which South West Museum Development will be responding to, moving forward. Museums are a vital and vibrant part of the cultural sector with the power to inspire and connect communities. Working together with museums the team will support the sector to respond ambitiously to the new strategy and the wider issues at play in society, along with their own unique circumstances.

Finally, little did we foresee the arrival of the Covid-19 pandemic in early March 2020 which has made such a significant impact on our lives, changing how we live and work. Our museums closed, and the long term impact on the cultural sector remains unknown. The only thing certain is that it will have a lasting impact. How we respond as individuals and collectively will ultimately determine our future. What our experience shows, from working with museums on their development for over 15 years is that we are a resilient sector, dedicated and committed to rising to the upcoming challenge of ensuring that museums are here for everyone now and in the years ahead.

# Adding value to museums in the south west in 2019/20

## £44,598\* awarded in Grants to museums

£3,149 was paid in grants to museums participating in our NLHF Rural Proofing Resilience Programme.

£610 was awarded in travel grants to support attendance at conferences and events including Why Museums Matter for Mental Health, the Touring Exhibitions Group workshop on Tactile Access in Collections and the Group for Education in Museums (GEM) annual conference.

14 museums awarded £16,933 from our Small Grant: Big Improvement scheme. We know that a small amount of money can make a big difference to our museums. This funding enabled projects including workplace wellbeing programmes, collaborative marketing activity oral history projects, and supported income generation.

5 museums were awarded £22,906 from our Development Fund to support them with priority actions identified through our Business Diagnostic.

## 9 museums supported to improve organisational resilience

9 museums across Gloucestershire, Wiltshire and the West of England participated in our Business Diagnostic. The organisational health check tool is supported with a process including peer assessment and specialist consultancy support to assess organisational performance and identify key areas for development to enhance organisational resilience.

of these museums went on to receive £22,906 funding from our Development Fund alongside specialist support from our Thematic Officers to address their priority organisational development needs.

## 608 delegates participated in our training

48 delegates engaged in our Copyright Forum and Museum Volunteering Forum and were supported to delve deep into all things copyright and volunteering. 42 training opportunities for museums were delivered by SW Museum Skills. Highlights included our conference on How Accreditation Can Power Your Museum to Success! in celebration of the newly refreshed Accreditation Standard and our successful

## £115,000 secured in additional earned income... up 50% from the previous year and reinvested in supporting **SW** museums

Each year we strive to secure additional grant funding to build on our Arts Council England Museum Development Grant. This additional funding allows us to deliver more, deeper and bespoke programmes of development support for museums across the region. 21p for every £1.00 the value of additional grant income and contract earnings we generated in relation to our Arts Council England core grant.

## Additional Grant funded Project -**Age Friendly Museums Network Hub**

38 elderly residents.

9 staff across the care homes supported and participated in the sessions.

4 partner organisations.

4 resources were created and brought together in a project report sharing our learning including top tips.

3 university student volunteers helped facilitate the pop-up museum sessions.

3 care homes.

Supported by The British Museum and The Baring Foundation we became one of the national Age Friendly Museums Network's Hubs in piloting partnership projects to make museums better places for older, more vulnerable people. We worked with Glenside Hospital Museum to develop their existing outreach activity; a pop-up museum, and the Bristol Hub at the University of Bristol who run LinkAges a project to combat loneliness and social isolation in students by supporting them to volunteer and visit care home residents.

## Additional Grant funded Project -**Rural Proofing Resilience**

£241,800 funding was secured from National Lottery Heritage Fund in partnership with Cornwall Museum Partnership to deliver a programme supporting rural and coastal museums across Cornwall, Devon, Dorset and Somerset to improve their resilience. The programme of development support focused on audience development, marketing, governance, finance and fundraising.

£110.000 of South West Museum Developments' funding was aligned to the NLHF funded project.

196 people engaged in the Rural Proofing Resilience Workshops.

14 museums participants supported with indepth mentoring, skills development.

Rural Proofing Resilience participant museums benefited from our SW Visitor Insights programme.

## **SW Visitor Insights**

3,385 visitor surveys were captured during the project period enabling participant organisations to plan effectively for future audiences.

10 cultural organisations supported to deliver a programme Audience Evaluation with as part of Torbay's Great Place Scheme.

South West Museum Development was contracted over two years to develop sustainable audience evaluation as part of a wider programme for Torbay Great Place by Torbay Development Agency. We delivered training, surveys and data evaluation to implement and develop a collective understanding of audiences and how they engage with local culture.

## **Annual Survey of Museums**

1,424 participating museum organisations from across 9 English regions.

58% of non-National Accredited museums engaged in the survey.


